The Land Councils are subject to the PGPA Act. Each is a corporate Commonwealth entity established to represent Aboriginal interests in a range of processes under the ALR Act.

The Northern Territory Land Councils are not subject to the ASL Offset Rule and are not included in the Prime Minister and Cabinet Portfolio ASL Cap.

### Funding

Indigenous Land Councils are regarded as 'not controlled' by the Commonwealth for accounting purposes. Accordingly, the Northern Territory Land Councils are not required to be consolidated into the Consolidated Financial Statements (CFS) and do not input estimates into the Central Budget Management System (CBMS) for reporting purposes. The Commonwealth recognises an investment in these entities only.

**Objective:** Represent Aboriginal interests in various processes under the *Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1976* (ALR Act). The Central Land Council and Northern Land Council are Native Title Representative Bodies under the Native Title Act 1993.

## Torres Strait Regional Authority

The Torres Strait Regional Authority (TSRA) formulates, implements and monitors the effectiveness of programs for Torres Strait Islander and Aboriginal people living in the Torres Strait, and also advises the Minister for Indigenous Affairs about issues relevant to Torres Strait Islander and Aboriginal people living in the Torres Strait region. The TSRA works to empower Torres Strait Islander and Aboriginal people living in the Torres Strait to determine their own affairs based on island custom.
