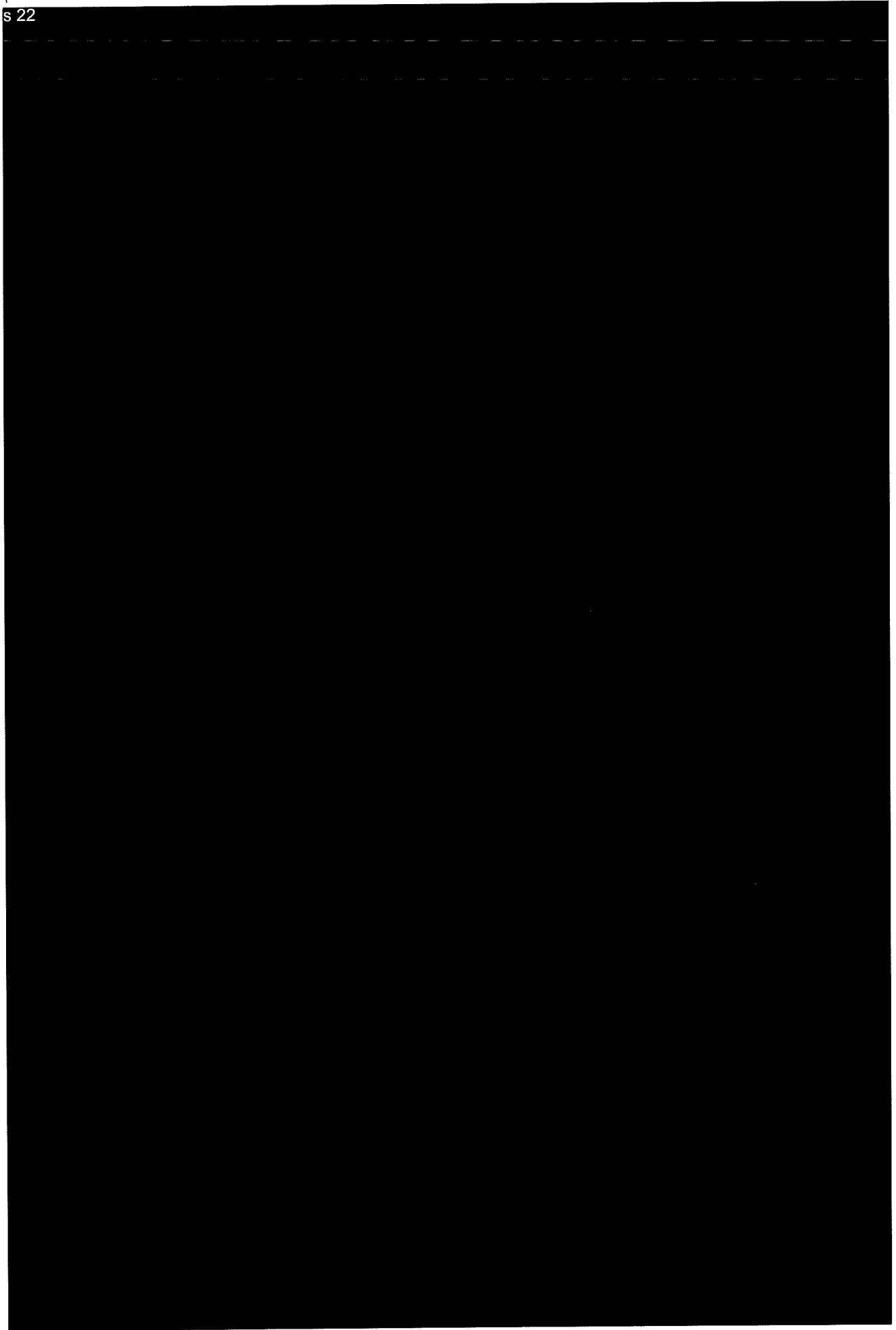

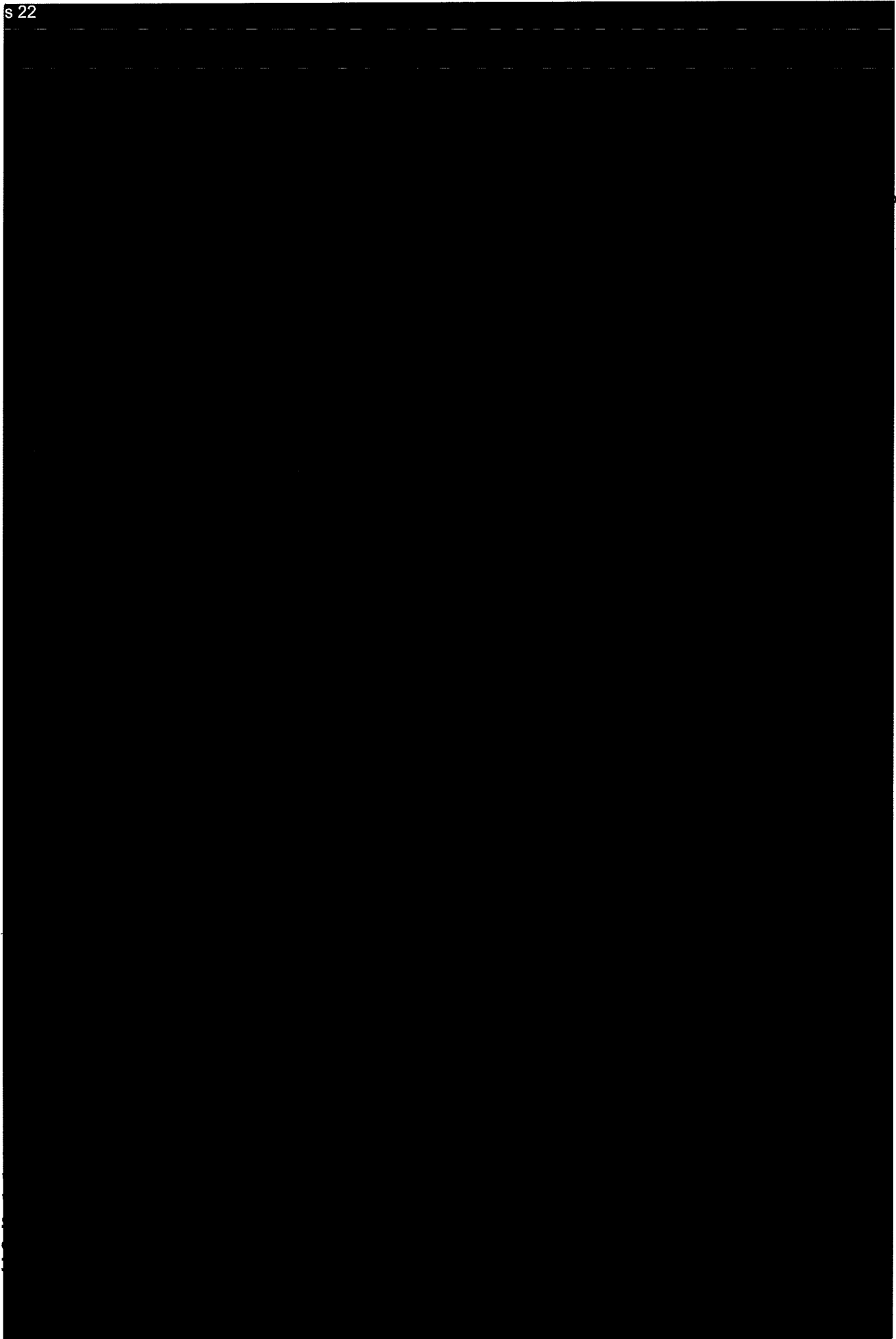

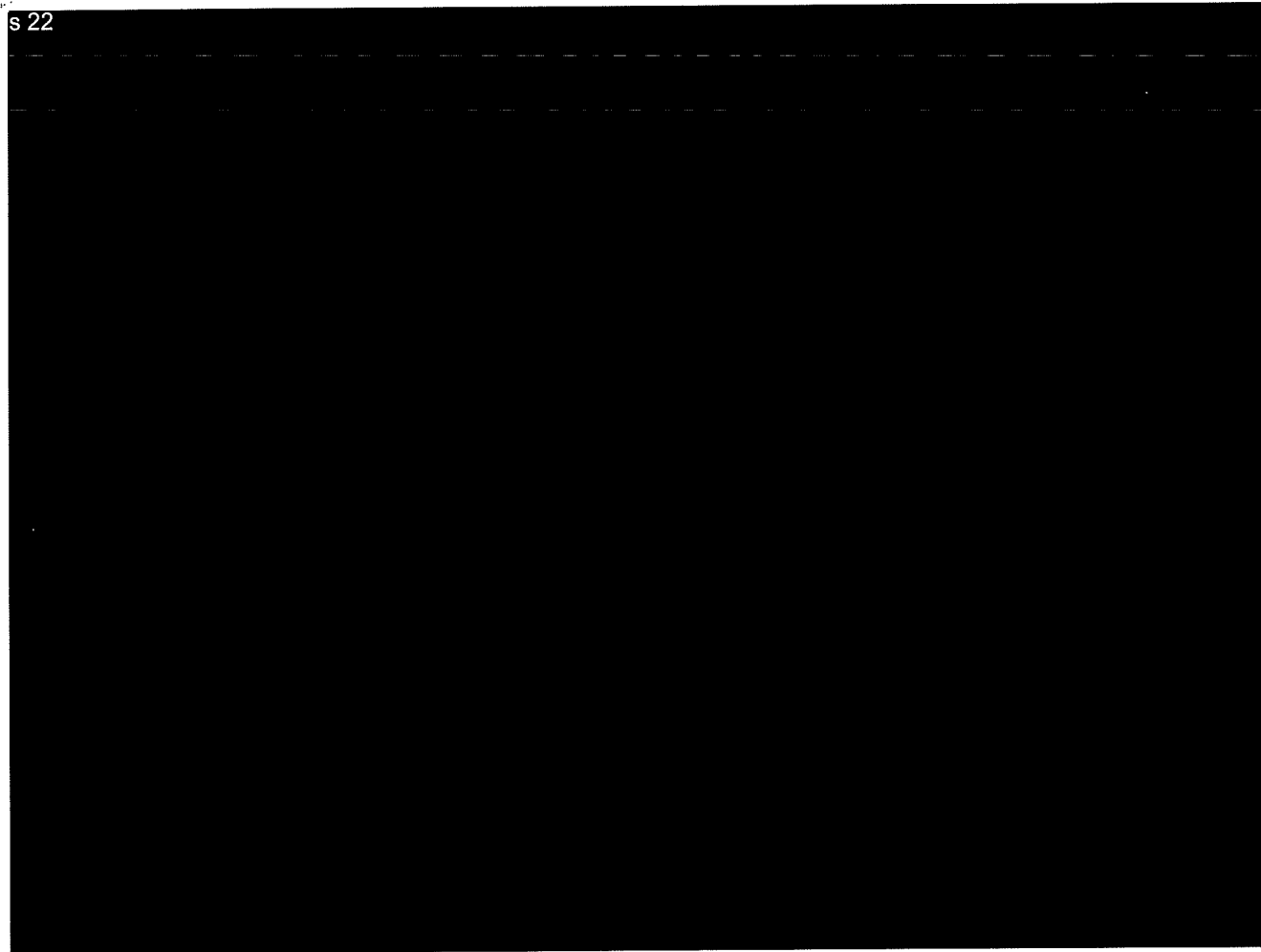

Dear Attorney-General

Thank you for your letter of 30 June 2014 seeking Queensland's agreement to proposed amendments to Part 5.3 of the *Criminal Code 1995 (Cth)* (the criminal code) pursuant to the *Intergovernmental Agreement on Counter-Terrorism Laws 2004*.

I understand the amendments to Part 5.3 of the criminal code are to be contained in the National Security Legislation Amendment Bill (No 1) 2014 (the Bill), which you intend to introduce in the Senate in the week commencing 14 July 2014.

I note your advice that the amendments to Part 5.3 contained in the Bill are minor and consequential, and flow from provisions in the Bill updating employment-related terminology under the *Australian Security Intelligence Organisation Act 1979*. On this basis, I am pleased to advise that Queensland has no objections to the proposed amendments.

I look forward to hearing from the Federal Government in due course in relation to the proposed national response to the Council of Australian Governments Review of Counter-Terrorism Laws.

Thank you for bringing this matter to my attention.
