



No - There was no issue with regards to religious sensitivities. The meal was prepared and served using equipment, including crockery, supplied by both Kirribilli House and the contracted caterer.

2. Was the food served prepared by an outside contracted Halal service, rather than prepared at Kirribilli's kitchen, to comply with religious and Halal requirements?

The food was prepared by a contracted Halal caterer.

Clarifications sought:

Religious protocols set out in Islam do recommend that Iftar meals are cooked in and served on plates and with cutlery and glassware that are not used by non-Islamic people. (This type of preference for festivities/breaking fasts is not limited to Islam). The protocols do state that if only cookware, plates, cutlery and glasses used by non-Islamic people is available, they can be used if washed properly.

I note you state the food was prepared by a contracted Halal caterer and that caterer also provided some crockery for serving. I take it the caterer used Kirribilli's kitchen to finalise some preparation.

Can you clarify if the guest plates, cutlery and glassware was provided by the caterer to comply with the religious requirements of guests?

It is a matter for PMC, but if you can provide the name of the Halal caterer I am happy to speak with them for clarification.

Apologies for what may appear to be a pedantic inquiry, but its important I understand the details as best I can so as not to overstate, nor understate, the effort made to ensure religious requirements were met.

Again, if a protocol document was established for catering the event and I can access it Im sure that would help me with the information I seek.

And finally, while full costs have not been assessed, can you provide the total cost known to date - or the contract catering cost alone - and the number of guests who attended.

The protocols do state that if only cookware, plates, cutlery and glasses used by non-Islamic people is available, they can be used if washed properly.

I note you state the food was prepared by a contracted Halal caterer and that caterer also provided some crockery for serving. I take it the caterer used Kirribilli's kitchen to finalise some preparation.

Can you clarify if the guest plates, cutlery and glassware was provided by the caterer to comply with the religious requirements of guests?

It is a matter for PMC, but if you can provide the name of the Halal caterer I am happy to speak with them for clarification.


