Alcohol and Other Drugs

The NT passed legislation last week to re-implement the Banned Drinkers Register (BDR). A person registered (by court order, or the Registrar following referral by police, family, health professional or self) cannot purchase, possess or supply alcohol. The previous BDR, introduced in July 2011 and repealed in August 2012 following a change in government, was not evaluated but anecdotal evidence indicated it was effective. Evaluation of the BDR will be critical given high rates of alcohol harm in the Territory.
