Purpose: To establish s22 new operations for the *Humanitarian Overseas Service Medal* (HOSM) following s22 s22 the department's subsequent consultation with relevant organisations in relation to eligibility criteria for each case.

2. We consulted s22 Australian organisations involved in relief operations, in relation to the eligibility criteria for the possible award of the HOSM for Samoa s22 s22 Attachment C refers).
 - a. The proposed declarations would allow members of these organisations who satisfy the conditions for an award to apply for an award.
 - b. Further organisations can be declared in future if necessary.

Eligibility criteria:

3. We settled the proposed eligible dates of service for each proposed clasp after consulting all relevant organisations about their members' dates of service and the nature of that service. We also had regard to the length of service necessary to qualify for the existing HOSM clasps for other natural disasters. Attachment D provides a list of the eligibility criteria for the 13 HOSM clasps to date, including clasps for service in response to both hazardous circumstances (items 1-11) and other natural disasters (items 12-13).
 - a. The qualifying period of service for the 11 clasps for hazardous circumstances is 30 days. The qualifying period of service for the 2 clasps for natural disasters is at least seven days service in the case of the 'Indian Ocean' tsunami clasp and at least 14 days service in the case of the 'Pakistan' earthquake clasp.
 - b. While comparisons between operations are difficult as the circumstances of each are unique, we propose maintaining qualifying periods of no less than 14 days for most natural disasters. The exceptional circumstances of the 'Indian Ocean' tsunami and 'Samoa' tsunami operations involved rapid responses and more than seven days minimum service in these cases would likely preclude recognition to most if not all relevant organisations and their members involved in the response operations.
4. We settled the proposed geographical area for each proposed clasp on the basis of consultation with relevant government departments, organisations and general research.
5. We propose HOSM clasps are declared for :
 - a. 'Samoa' for a minimum of seven days service between the date of the earthquake and tsunami on 29 September 2009 and 10 October 2009;

6. The attached letter to the Governor-General seeks her approval of the proposed declarations (Attachment A).

Financial implications:

7. The establishment of HOSM operations has minor financial impacts for PM&C (drafting) and the Honours and Awards Secretariat at Government House (production of clasps). These expenses would be absorbed within existing resources.

Background:

8. The HOSM is awarded to individuals who provide humanitarian service with eligible organisations during operations in hazardous circumstances overseas.
9. The HOSM Regulations provide for the Governor-General, on your recommendation, to declare an operation specifying certain details such as geographical extent, dates, organisations (the members of which can be eligible for the HOSM) and certain types of restrictions of eligibility.

Samoa 2009

10. On 29 September 2009 at approximately 6.48am an 8.3 magnitude earthquake struck in the Samoan Islands region, followed minutes later by a 5 to 10 metre tsunami. It killed 143 people, caused an estimated \$41 million worth of damage, and displaced approximately 3,500 people.
11. Response operations by various organisations were conducted between 29 September 2009 and 10 October 2009. The rescue lasted two days and the relief phase lasted five days. In this case a shorter than usual qualifying period of seven days service is proposed.

Humanitarian Overseas Medal Regulations 2011

I, QUENTIN BRYCE, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting on the recommendation of the Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister, make the following declaration under subregulation 3 (1) of the *Humanitarian Overseas Medal Regulations 2011*.

Section 1

1 Name of declaration

This declaration is the *Humanitarian Overseas Service Medal (Samoa) Declaration 2012*.

2 Commencement

This declaration commences on the day it is made.

3 Definitions

In this declaration:

Regulations means the *Humanitarian Overseas Medal Regulations 2011*.

4 Declared Operation

For subregulations 3 (1) and (7) of the Regulations, the declared operation is the humanitarian aid operation arising out of the earthquake and tsunami in Samoa on 29 September 2009.

5 Name of Operation

For paragraph 4 (1) (a) of the Regulations, the name by which the declared operation is to be known is 'Samoa'.

6 Operational area

For paragraph 4 (1) (b) of the Regulations, the area in which the declared operation occurred consists of the administrative district of Apia and surrounding regions.

7 Period of declared operation

For paragraph 4 (1) (c) of the Regulations, the period during which the declared operation occurred is the period beginning 29 September 2009 and ending 10 October 2009.

8 Organisations

For subregulation 5 (1) of the Regulations, an organisation mentioned in column 2 of an item in Schedule 1 is specified in relation to eligible service carried out by the organisation during the period mentioned in column 3 of the item.

9 Qualifying period of service

For paragraph 5 (5) (b) of the Regulations, the qualifying period of service is any 7 day period during the period beginning on 29 September 2009 and ending on 10 October 2009.

1. On 30 April 2012, on your recommendation, the Governor-General made declarations that the earthquake and tsunami in Samoa in 2009^{s22}

2. Since the publication of the declarations in the Commonwealth Gazette, through feedback from organisations that deployed staff to provide humanitarian assistance in response to each of these natural disasters, the Department has become aware of the need for various amendments to the declarations.
