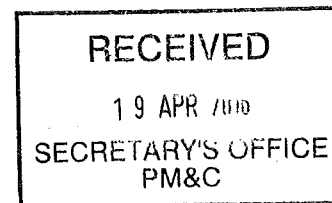

BREACH OF THE LOBBYING CODE OF CONDUCT

As a s47F with a strong desire to uphold the integrity of the Australian political system, I wish to report a serious breach of the Lobbying Code of Conduct by s47F and s47F, listed on the Lobbyists' Register under s47G. This breach is not only formal, it goes to the essence of the government's objective of compliance with the requirements of the code "in accordance with their spirit, intention and purpose".

s47F in defiance of the Code's requirement that the Register shall not include "a member of a state or federal political party executive or administrative committee", s47F

The impropriety of lobbyists determining candidates for political office who they may, on election, then approach on behalf of paying clients, represents an intolerable conflict of interests and is in clear breach of the stated intent of the code: "to promote trust in the integrity of government processes and ensure that contact between lobbyists and Government representatives is conducted in accordance with public expectations of transparency, integrity and honesty".

It would be unfortunate if this breach were not to be resolved before the political atmosphere becomes even more confrontational when the upcoming election campaign begins. It has already been the subject of media attention and there is a clear need for the Commonwealth to enforce a code of conduct for lobbyists that is so clearly in the public interest.

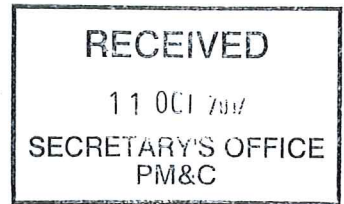

I write with concern regarding recent reports in the s47F & s47G

The Lobbying Code of Conduct specifies that lobbying organisations must be registered. s47F

The Code also stipulates that lobbyists must not be '*a member of a state or federal political party executive*'.

For s47F to simply remove his name from the register and claim that he is not actively involved in direct lobbying makes a mockery of the obvious intent of the Code to prevent conflicts of interest.

As such, I seek clarification as to what steps the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet have taken to ensure s47F does not present a conflict.

I also ask that the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet thoroughly investigate all Government contracts awarded to organisations represented by s47F

This matter raises serious concerns and it must be addressed as a matter of urgency.

I have ceased attending meetings of this body and have appointed a proxy delegate. Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing in relation to the position of registered lobbyists holding party political offices. As noted in emails sent on 25 September 2013 and 17 January 2014, members of a state or federal political party executive, state executive or administrative committee (of the equivalent body) may not remain on the Register of Lobbyists (the Register) after 20 March 2014.

To that end, we request your advice **by Friday 7 March 2014;**

- in relation to yourself and each person employed, contracted or otherwise engaged by your organisation or firm to carry out lobbying activities,
- whether or not that person is a member of a state or federal political party executive, state executive or administrative committee (of the equivalent body).

Clause 10.3 (c) of the Lobbying Code of Conduct (the Code) states that the Secretary may remove a lobbyist or person who is an employee of a lobbyist, or a contractor or person

engaged by a lobbyist, from the Register of Lobbyists if, in the opinion of the Secretary, the lobbyist fails to answer questions within a reasonable period of time relating to the lobbyist's details on the Register or the lobbyist's lobbying activities.

On 20 March 2014, we will remove from the Register any currently registered lobbyist:

- who is a member of a state or federal political party executive, state executive or administrative committee (of the equivalent body); or
- **whose status in relation to such offices has not been advised.**

Approximately ten days ago a fellow party member brought to my attention that I was included on the list of members of the s47F. This committee has constitutional duties in the administration of the affairs governing the party's decision-making processes in s 47F. I had been asked informally if I would be willing to offer my services to this committee of the party in s47F and had agreed in principle. I did not receive any formal approach or any formal notification of my appointment. Had I, I would have immediately refused after having reflected on the constitutional status of the committee in detail.

On the s47F I received an email from the s47F concerning an agenda for a s47F meeting. Copies of this correspondence and emails in response are attached for your record. I have not received any communications since this correspondence relating to this committee and I have taken no role whatsoever in any of its meetings, correspondence, decisions or activities whatsoever.

I attach a letter sent by me by mail on Friday to the s47F that is self explanatory.

I do not believe that I have breached the Lobbyists Code of Conduct as I have never been formally appointed to this committee, have never partaken in any of its activities or been aware that I had been considered a member of this committee other than is expressed in the attached email correspondence. I have now formally requested the s47F to withdraw my name from the list of members of this committee.

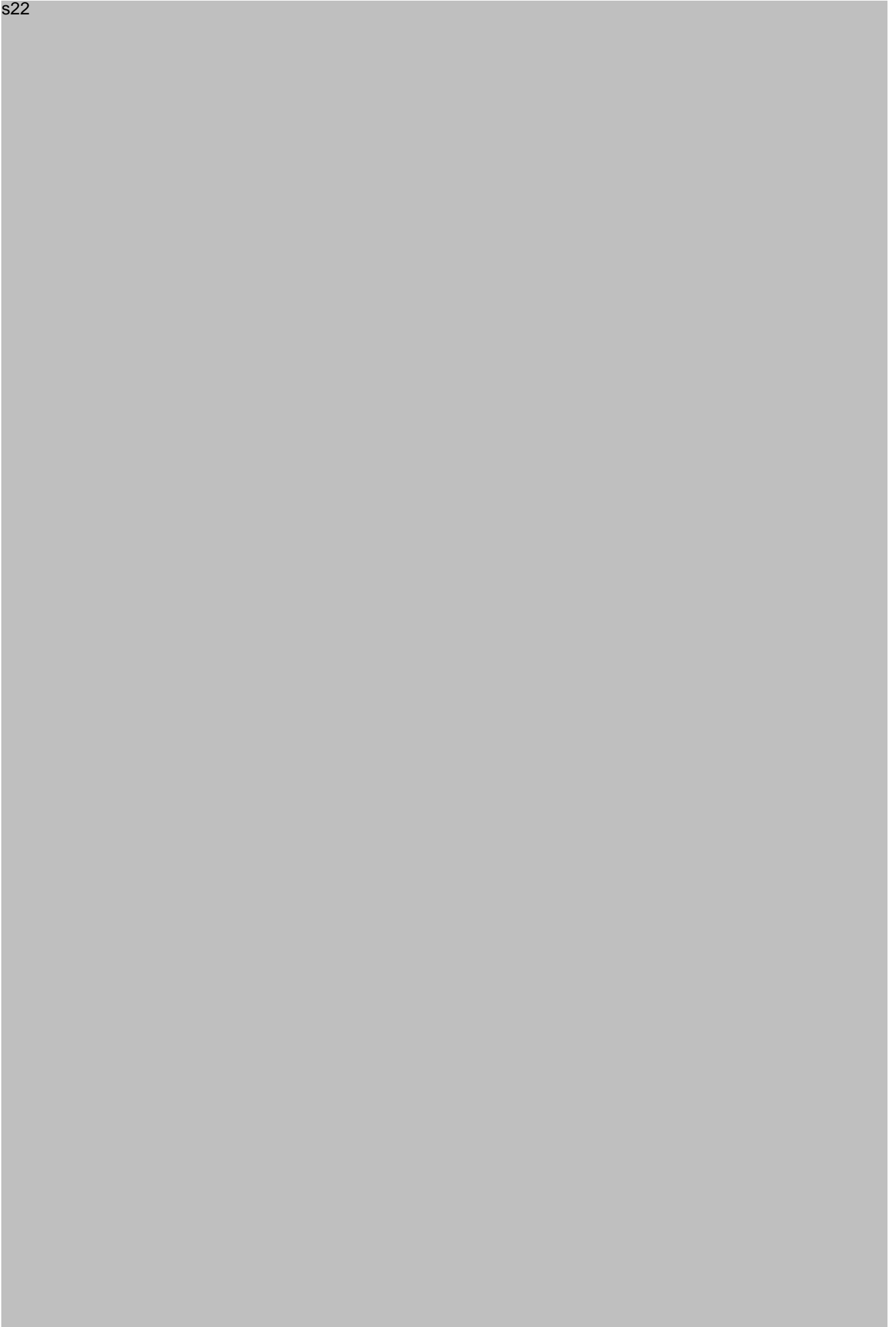

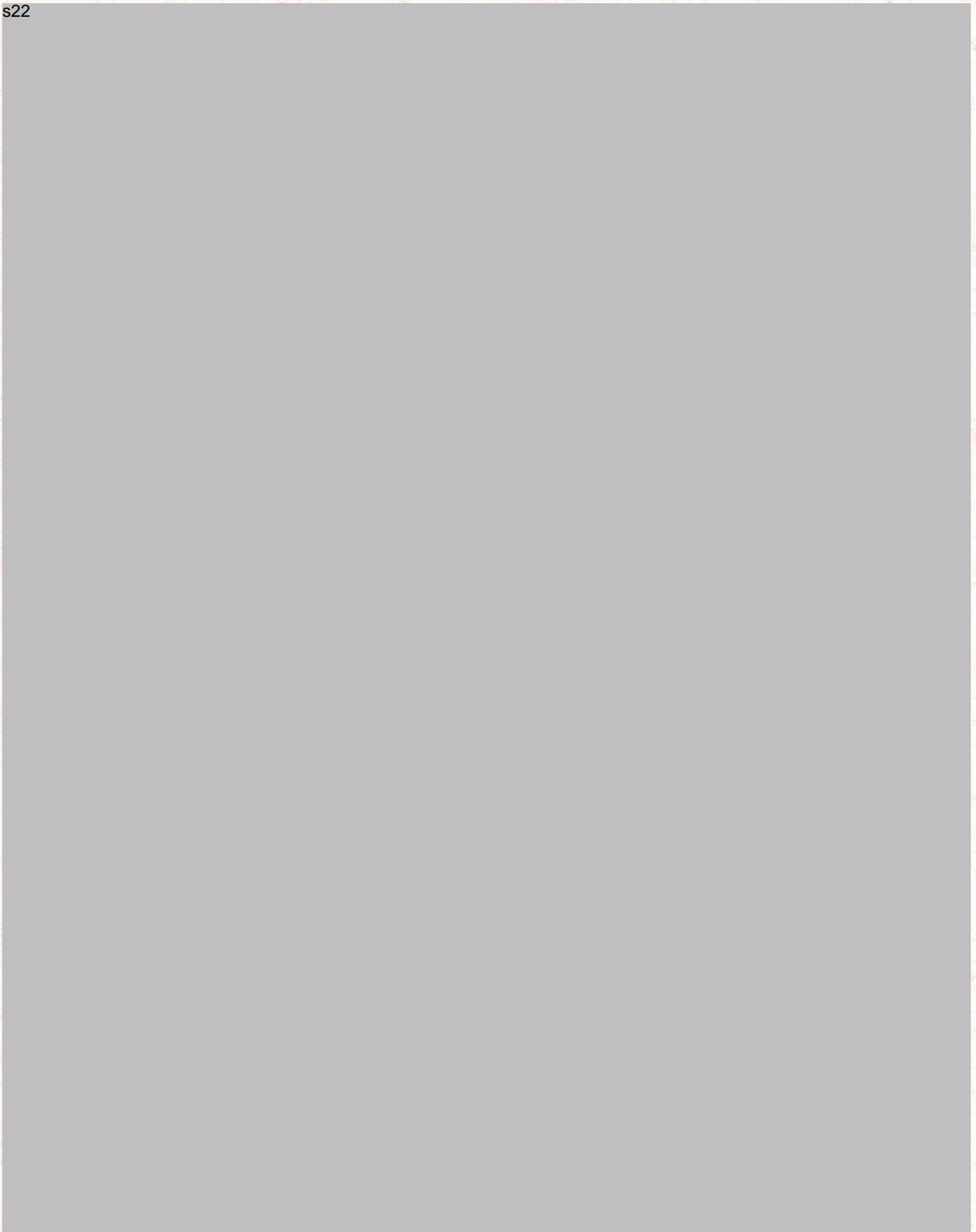

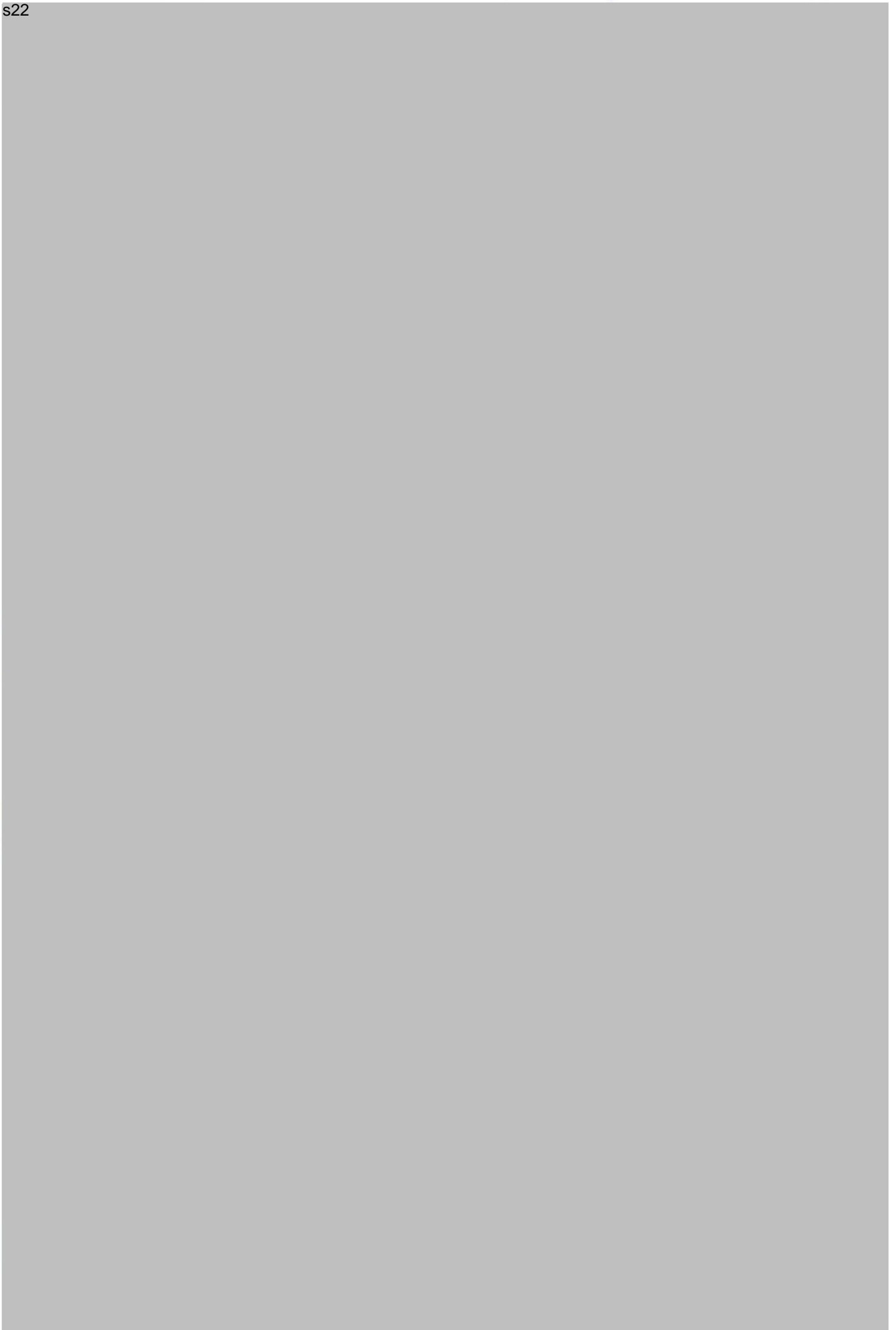
