As the Government prepares to shortly decide on carbon pollution reduction targets for the year 2020, I am writing to notify you of one of Australia's largest ever online petitions. Currently 120,036 Australians have signed GetUp's petition calling for bold action to cut Australia's carbon emissions.

In your electorate of Griffith:

• 2298 residents of Griffith have signed this petition calling on the Government to take sweeping action on climate change.

We know government action on climate change is a high priority for Australians across the country, as it is in your electorate. The Australian community is on board, and prepared to meet the Government and business community in taking the steps necessary to make sure Australia is not left behind in the transition to a new green economy.

That means bold action must be taken and strong short-term targets set to ensure Australia does not suffer in the long-term. Economic opportunities abound in an economic future that invests heavily in renewable energy and creates green-collar jobs, and that relies on the certainty offered by the setting of a strong short-term carbon pollution reduction targets.

With so many of your constituents having indicated they are willing to play a role in climate change solutions, and expect their representatives to do the same, we believe there is a strong community mandate for the Government to proceed with setting the bold short-term target needed of at least a 25% reduction of 1990 levels by 2020.



As the caucus meets over the coming days to decide on carbon pollution reduction targets, we would like to assist you in making this important decision by providing for you the results of some important polling of ALP supporters that GetUp conducted this week.

Our polling of GetUp members who identify as Labor voters indicates that if the Federal Government fails to deliver on strong climate action many of those Labor supporters will switch their vote at the next federal election to a party with stronger climate policy. In some cases the huge number of Labor-voting GetUp members is enough to put seats including Melbourne, Grayndler, Sydney, Adelaide & Eden-Monaro in jeopardy.

A target range that does not include at least a 25% by 2020 reduction, as recommended by Professor Garnaut as part of global greenhouse gas stabilisation at 450 ppm, will be unacceptable to the Australian public and unacceptable to GetUp members.

Conversely a unique opportunity exists to build our new green economy, green jobs and industries while supporting the base of your party.

GetUp members are committed to seeing the Federal Government take strong action on climate change.

GetUp members are opinion-formers in the community. They clearly articulate their position and are instrumental in influencing the votes of their peers, neighbours and family members come election time. This multiplies their impact and makes our polling all the more concerning for the ALP.

The polling report overleaf shows that nationally 47% of GetUp members who traditionally support Labor are very likely to switch their votes, while 33% are somewhat likely to do so. GetUp members are active political donors, volunteers and opinion leaders whose views resonate throughout their network of friends, family and colleagues. These polling figures indicate a significant problem for the ALP should the Federal Government announce weak carbon reduction targets below 25% as recommended by Professor Ross Garnaut.

There is a strong community mandate for the Government to proceed with setting the strong short term targets needed to tackle climate change – at least 25% carbon pollution reduction over 2000 levels by 2020. This is the lowest number in the 25 – 40% reduction recommended for industrialised countries by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change; and the minimum number required to stabilise global greenhouse emissions at 450 parts per million Co2-e, which was found to be in Australia's best interests by Professor Garnaut.

Certainly it is our intention to respond positively to target ranges that include 25%. On the contrary, our members will inform Australians very clearly of the impacts of targets below 25%. For example, any target under 25% will undermine any chance of a global deal that would save the Great Barrier Reef, Kakadu and the Murray Darling Basin. Our members understand this and are regularly requesting us to inform other Australians through advertising and other methods.

It is our intention to do so only should the maximum target included in the range be below 25%.

Thus I highlight to you the importance of setting acceptable targets of at least 25% carbon pollution reduction over 2000 levels by 2020, and offer you an empirical breakdown of the results of our polling attached to this letter.

Methodology

The data for this report was gathered from an online survey conducted by GetUp.org.au from November 29th to December 2nd. All respondents have elected to receive emails from GetUp; they are not a representative section of the broader community and have not been weighted to reflect Australian Bureau of Statistic (ABS) data. Age bracket and gender data on respondents are available.

Respondents were identified as electorate residents by the postcodes they have provided GetUp, matched with electorate postcode data provided by the AEC. Some postcodes straddle federal electorates, and thus a small proportion of respondents may be outside the stated electorates.

Responses are limited to one per person by an IP filter that prevents return access to the survey. Full data set is available on request.

OPEN LETTER CALLING FOR IMMEDIATE CLIMATE ACTION

Together we represent unions and workers, social welfare organisations, faith-based organisations, and environment groups large and small, local and national.

We share a common goal of a fast and fair transition to a low carbon economy that we know will create millions of clean energy jobs and help drive ambitious global climate action.

We know that this will be a challenging transition requiring decisive political leadership.

As you have said, climate change is one of the greatest moral and economic challenges of our time, but the benefits of action will be substantial. The benefits will include a competitive Australian economy in the already booming global clean energy economy.

We call on you to act on carbon pollution and climate change before the next election. We call on you to get started with an immediate price on carbon to begin the process of serious emissions reductions.

While separately our organisations support a range of actions, we all support, at the least, an immediate two year levy on carbon pollution from Australia's biggest emitters. The levy can fund reducing pollution, supporting Australian households, helping industry to transition to cleaner practices, and further boost Australia's renewable energy sector. Immediate action will provide increased certainty for business that wants to invest in clean technologies and climate solutions, and are currently hesitant.

A two year levy, similar to that proposed by Professor Garnaut, is not a substitute for a long-term limit and price on carbon, but it will get the job of cleaning up Australia's economy underway.

We urge you to negotiate with the Senate in this term of Parliament to pass legislation that makes our largest companies pay for their carbon pollution and begins the

transition to a clean energy economy. With your leadership, Australia can start the shift to a clean energy economy and help rebuild momentum for ambitious global action.
