Purpose: To provide policy approval for certain measures in the bills; to provide approval for introduction of the bills; and to ensure introduction of the bills is subject to all necessary clearances being obtained.

#### **Description of Measures:**

- 1. The Tobacco Plain Packaging Bill regulates to prevent tobacco advertising and promotion on tobacco product packaging in order to: reduce the attractiveness and appeal of the product to consumers, particularly young people; reduce the ability of the tobacco package to mislead consumers about the harmful effects of smoking or using tobacco products; and increase the noticeability and effectiveness of health warnings.
- The Trade Marks Amendment (Tobacco Plain Packaging) Bill clarifies the relationship between the Tobacco Plain Packaging Bill and the Trade Marks Act 1995.

#### PM&C Advice:

- 3. The memorandum provided by the Office of Parliamentary Counsel indicates that the bills have policy approval for some provisions, but require further approval for other provisions. The Minister sought policy approval in a letter dated 23 June 2011 to the Prime Minister.
  - a. Our relevant policy branches recommend agreement to the outstanding policy. A letter approving the minor policy matters is attached, for your signature on behalf of the Prime Minister if you agree.
  - b. While not specifically sought in the Minister's letter, the policy branches recommend that approval should also be provided for the proposed amendments to the Trade Marks Act 1995 that would allow regulations to be made in relation to the operation of the Tobacco Plain Packaging Act 2011 on the Trade Marks Act 1995.
- 4. The Minister for Innovation, Industry, Science and Research has approved the text of the Trade Marks Amendment (Tobacco Plain Packaging) Bill which amends the Trade Marks Act 1995.
- The Minister for Health and Ageing has approved the bills and accompanying explanatory memoranda.

The proposal to amend the *Trade Marks Act* 1995 (the Act) to allow regulations to be made in relation to the operation of the *Tobacco Plain Packaging Act* 2011 on the Act (including a power to deem conditions to be met, and to make regulations that are inconsistent with the Act) is also agreed. I understand that the Minister for Innovation, Industry, Science and Research, Senator the Hon Kim Carr, has agreed to the introduction of these amendments via the Trade Marks Amendment (Tobacco Plain Packaging) Bill which is to be introduced as part of the Government's plain packaging legislation.
