DFAT put this decision into practice, establishing a Tender Evaluation Plan, a Tender Evaluation Board(TEB), and the Secretary of DFAT as Approver. The TEB consisted of representatives from PM&C, Treasury, Finance and DBCDE nominated by their portfolio ministers and a Chair, appointed by me from outside Government – Pamela Fayle, a former


Deputy Secretary of DFAT and Ambassador to Germany, with considerable experience in Asia.
