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# ATTACHMENT A

Dear Colleagues

As you know, as a Department we take seriously our obligations under the <u>Freedom of Information</u> <u>Act 1982 (Cth)</u> (the FOI Act). Noting that we have a relatively high and constant FOI caseload, and that we regularly have officers and SES decision makers rotating through the Department, I thought that it would be timely to remind all staff of the Department's statutory obligations under the FOI Act.

The objects of the FOI Act are to give the Australian community access to information held by the Government of the Commonwealth, and in short, provide every person with a right of access to documents held by government agencies, unless the documents are exempt from disclosure.

The Secretary has authorised all SES officers in the Department to be decision-makers on FOI requests received. All staff are able to access a range of guidance material, checklists and fact sheets on the <u>intranet</u>. The FOI & Privacy Section is also available to provide assistance or training to line areas if required (contact details are **below**).

If you are involved in the processing of an FOI request at PM&C, it is important that you undertake this work with a couple of core considerations in mind, including:

- The objects clause of the FOI Act (section 3): staff are expected to perform and exercise functions in accordance with the objects and purposes of the FOI Act, as far as possible, to facilitate and promote public access to information, promptly and at the lowest reasonable cost.
- FOI is time critical (30 days goes very quickly): the Department must comply with strict statutory timeframes when responding to valid FOI requests under the FOI Act. This requires immediate engagement and accountability by all staff involved in processing an FOI requests, from initiation to its completion.

In addition to the FOI Act and the <u>Guidelines issued by the Australian Information Commissioner</u> (the FOI Guidelines), the Department's Business Rules are to be followed in the processing of FOI requests. All staff who are involved in FOI processing should be familiar with, and act in accordance with, the Department's internal processes and procedures as outlined in the Business Rules.

As most of you would know, time is of the essence with the processing of FOI requests as we are required to adhere to strict statutory timeframes. Subject to any extensions of the statutory timeframe, we must take all reasonable steps to notify FOI applicants of a decision on their request within 30 days of receiving a request.

I am grateful for all of the ongoing work that the Department has undertaken in the FOI space, and I am pleased to say that we currently have no overdue requests. While I know that this adds to your already heavy workload, it is really important that this high standard continues so that PM&C remains an exemplar of best practice across the APS.

# Audit of FOI caseload and processing periods for 2019 – 2020

The Department presently has no overdue FOI requests and a 100% compliance rate with statutory timeframes for finalising valid FOI requests received between 1 January 2020 – 23 February 2020.

# Calendar Year

Between 1 January 2019 – 31 December 2019, the Department <u>received</u> **389 requests.** Of the 389 requests received, **302** were **valid FOI requests** comprising:

- 5 valid personal information FOI requests
- 297 valid non-personal FOI requests
  - 43 of these requests were transferred to other agencies pursuant to section 16 of the FOI Act
  - **69** of these requests were withdrawn by applicants or otherwise withdrawn through mechanisms provided under the FOI Act (eg. deemed withdrawals in response to charges or a practical refusal consultation notice period).

During this same period, **187 valid FOI requests** were <u>finalised by active decision</u> of the Department. Of these, **161** valid FOI requests were finalised in time, representing an **86.1%** compliance rate. This compliance rate does not include withdrawals or transfers, which would bolster the Department's finalisation rate.

# Financial Year

The 2019/2020 financial year breakdown is as follows:

1 July 2019 – 23 February 2020 (Current 2019/2020 FY):

- **287** requests <u>received</u>, **245** valid FOI requests (includes transfers and withdrawals but not internal reviews or requests for Information Commissioner review).
- 90.2% (138 out of 153 requests) of all requests <u>finalised by active decision</u> of the Department between 1 July –23 February 2020 were finalised on time.
- All IAG-related matters received by the Department during this period were transferred to the National Indigenous Australian Agency (NIAA) following the machinery of government (MOG) changes on 1 July 2019.
- This means the total valid FOI caseload and number of active decisions made by the Department more than doubled from the previous six-month period, despite the MOG changes.

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
