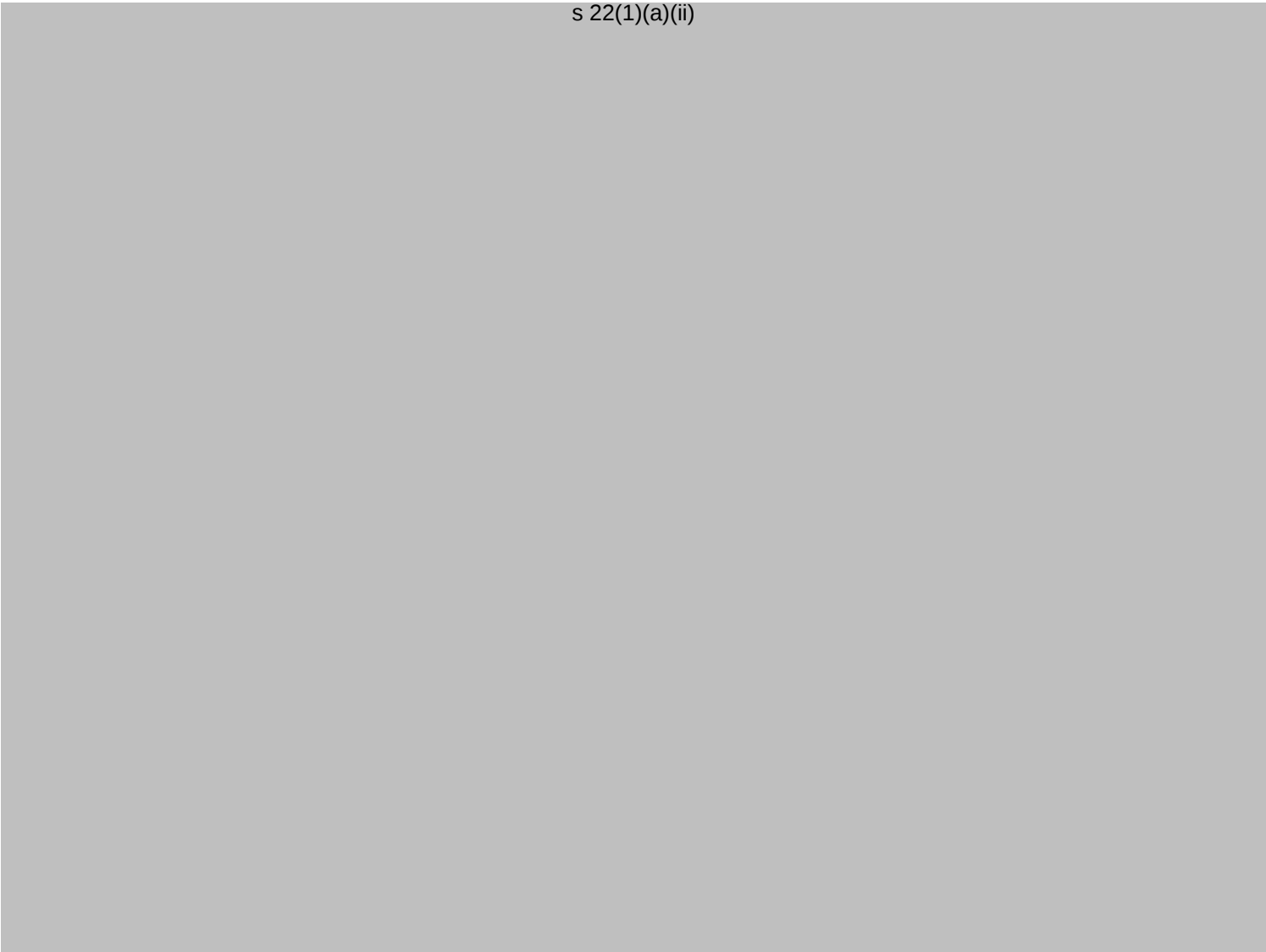

- Brent crude oil prices have risen to **US\$117** a barrel, a **66%** increase since the start of the conflict.
- Average petrol prices at petrol stations are **219.5** cents per litre.
- A temporary 20% Minimum Stockholding Obligation reduction took effect from 19 March. Stockholdings as at 10 March is: 37 days for petrol; 29 days for jet fuel; and 30 day for diesel.
- Australia's gas markets remain well supplied and the average east coast gas price sitting at around **\$10/GJ**.

Fuel Supply Outlook

- Domestic fuel prices continue to rise. National average prices for week ending 22 March were **238 c/l for petrol** (up 19 c/l on last week) and **282 c/l for diesel** (up 37 c/l).
 - While fuel supplies remain at normal levels, localised shortages have emerged as a result of increased purchasing.
- Brent crude oil prices were **US\$110** a barrel at close of trade 20 March 2026, down 6% from Friday.
- A temporary 20% Minimum Stockholding Obligation reduction took effect from 19 March. Stockholdings as of 17 March is: 38 days for petrol; 30 days for jet fuel; and 30 day for diesel.
- Australia's gas markets remain well supplied; average east coast gas price around **\$8.75/GJ**.

Key Government Actions

Commonwealth Government

State and Territory

- Public Transport: Victoria and Tasmania have announced free public transport for 1 month and 3 months respectively. The ACT has halved its maximum monthly cap on the number of paid trips on public transport for 12 weeks.
- Legislation: WA, and the NT have activated laws to compel fuel companies to provide data on fuel supply. Tasmania has passed legislation to increase their information gathering powers.
- Freight: NSW has introduced temporary freight measures to keep goods moving and help ease fuel pressures. Victoria is supporting freight businesses to invest in low and zero-emission vehicles, infrastructure and technology.

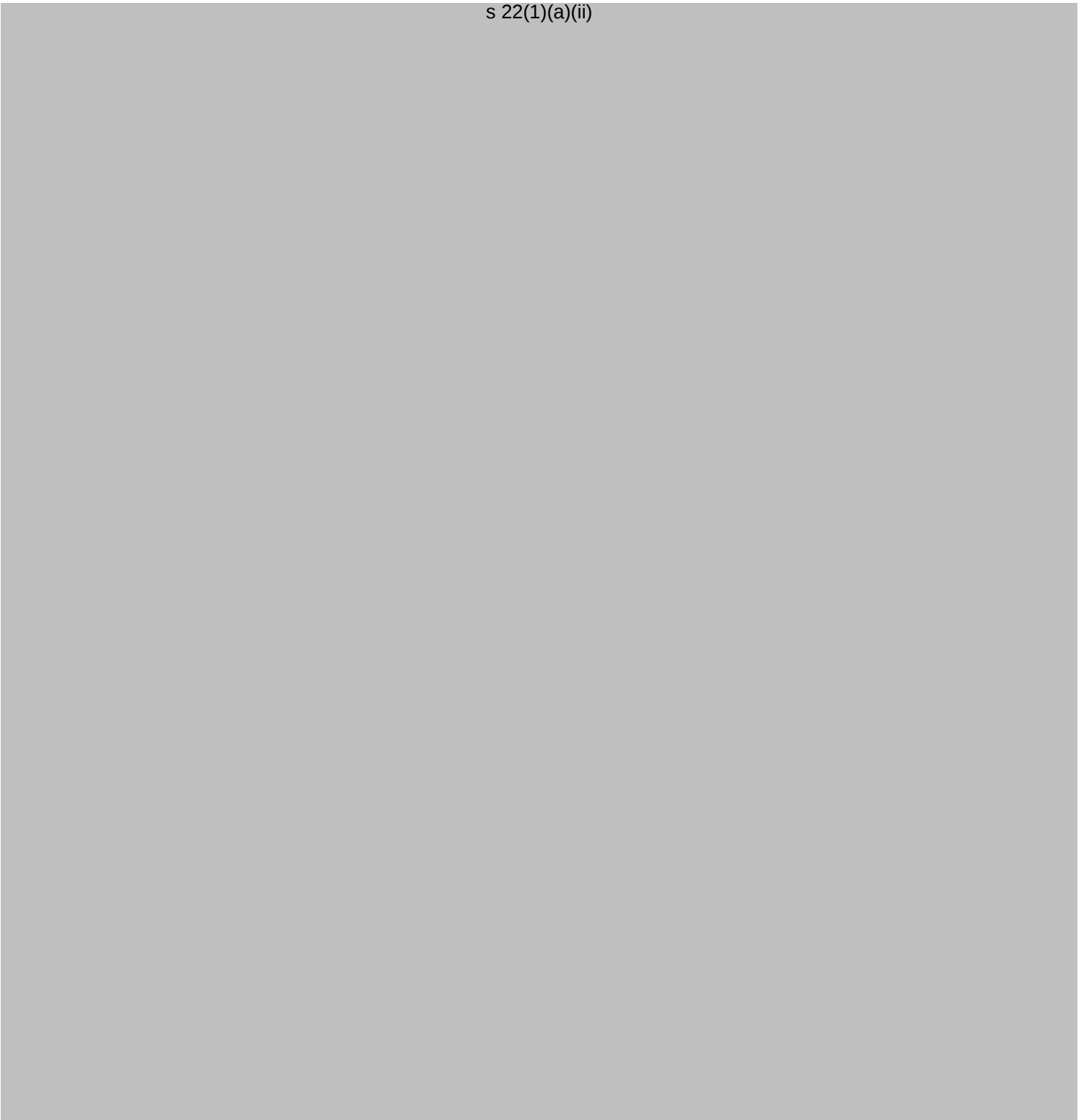

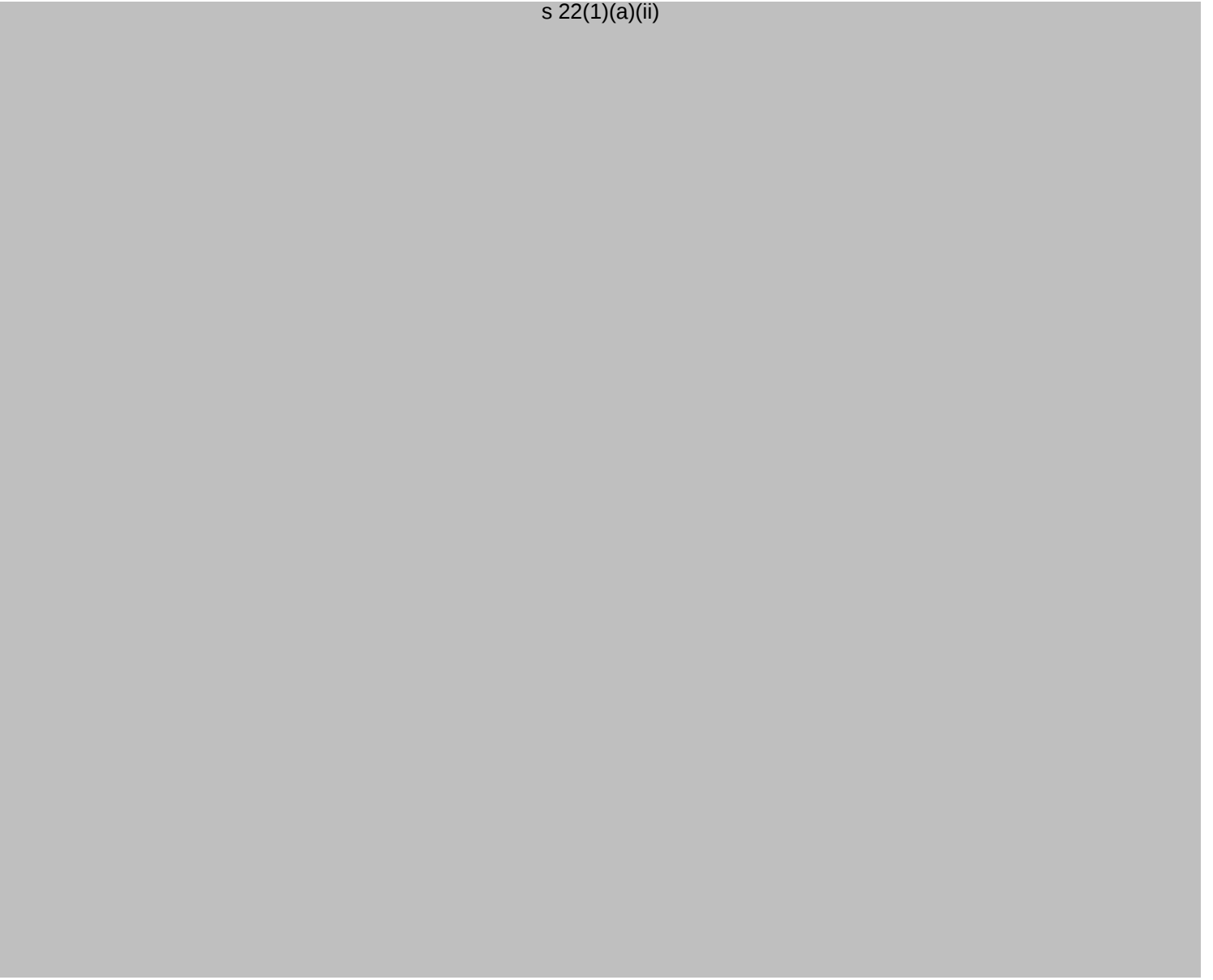

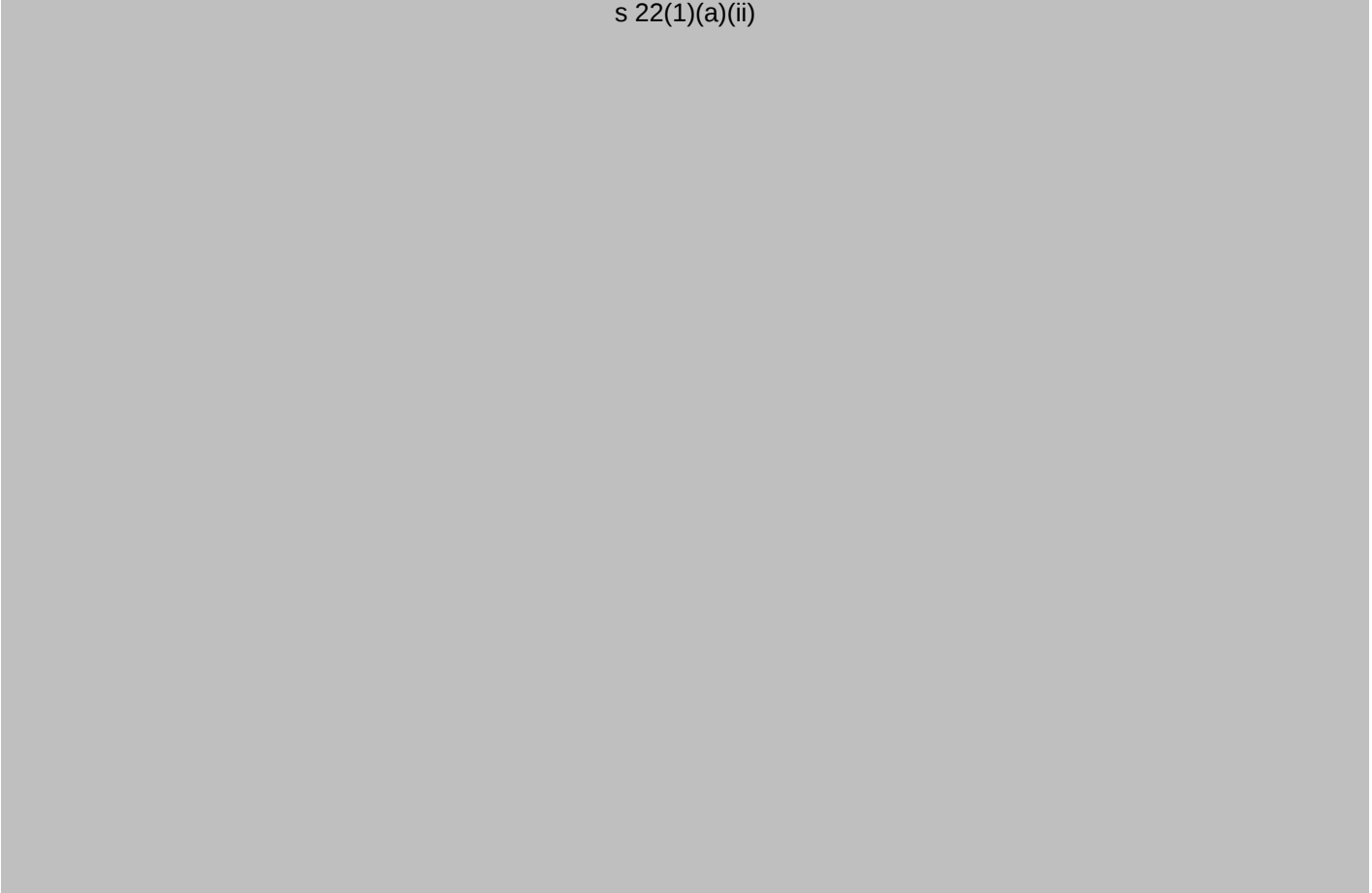
