Hello Tim,

Thank you for meeting with Fortescue last week, we greatly appreciate your and your colleagues' time.

As requested, please see below summary of **Fortescue's recent decarbonisation progress:**

- Currently we have been **installing around 3,600 solar panels a day** while working on our **190MW Cloudbreak solar farm**, which is around two-thirds complete.
- We've just announced we've **started construction on our 440MW Solomon Airport solar farm**, which is expected to be completed in 2028, with approximately **671,000 solar panels to be installed during the build.**
- A proposed 644MW solar farm at Turner River is anticipated to commence construction later this year. Once operational, the Solomon, Cloudbreak and Turner River projects – together with the existing 100MW North Star Junction solar farm – will deliver **around 1.3GW of solar capacity**. This is equivalent to powering around half a million Australian homes each year.
- Through Pilbara Energy Connect, **Fortescue has already constructed more than 480 kilometres of high-voltage transmission lines** across the Pilbara. Once complete, the network will extend to more than 620 kilometres, physically linking Fortescue's energy assets to its operations and rail network.

Dear Prime Minister

At a time of global energy volatility, Australia must take control of its energy future.

Last week, Fortescue announced we are building the world's largest off-grid renewable energy system to decarbonise our industrial operations, with delivery accelerated to 2028. It proves heavy industry can run reliably, profitably and at scale on green energy.

Yet government policy still rewards some of the nation's largest companies for burning imported diesel.

I urge your Government to amend the Fuel Tax Credit Act 2006 to introduce a hard cap of \$50 million per company, per year.

This is a practical and overdue reform. It would preserve support for farmers, transport operators and other essential industries, while stopping a small number (15 in total) of very large, predominantly mining, companies from receiving excessive benefits at public expense.

The current scheme refunds around \$11 billion a year to business, with a disproportionate share flowing to a handful of large miners. Meanwhile, Australian households and small businesses pay fuel excise in full.

That is not fair, and it is not sustainable.

Recent global instability has again exposed the risk of relying on imported diesel. Australia remains vulnerable to shocks far beyond our control. Uncapped fuel tax credits entrench that dependence instead of driving investment in stronger, cleaner and more secure domestic energy.

Industry now has a clear alternative. Large-scale operations can transition away from fossil fuels while improving energy security and cost certainty. Public policy should accelerate that shift, not hold it back.

A \$50 million cap is balanced reform. It preserves support where it is genuinely needed, while ending excessive claims by major corporations.

Fortescue is one of the largest recipients of fuel tax credits. We do not make this proposal lightly. We make it because it is in the national interest.

I appreciate this is a busy period. I tried to reach you last week and also offered to meet Treasurer Chalmers in Washington this week to discuss the proposal directly. I urge you to consider this reform in the May Budget.

It presents an opportunity to redirect savings toward priorities that directly benefit Australians – such as cost-of-living relief, healthcare, and investment in Australian energy systems – while strengthening national resilience.

This is not about dismantling the fuel tax credit system. It is about modernising it so it is fairer, more responsible and aligned with Australia’s long-term energy security.

Fortescue will support this reform publicly in the lead-up to the Budget, because Australians deserve a system that backs the future, not one that subsidises dependence on imported diesel.

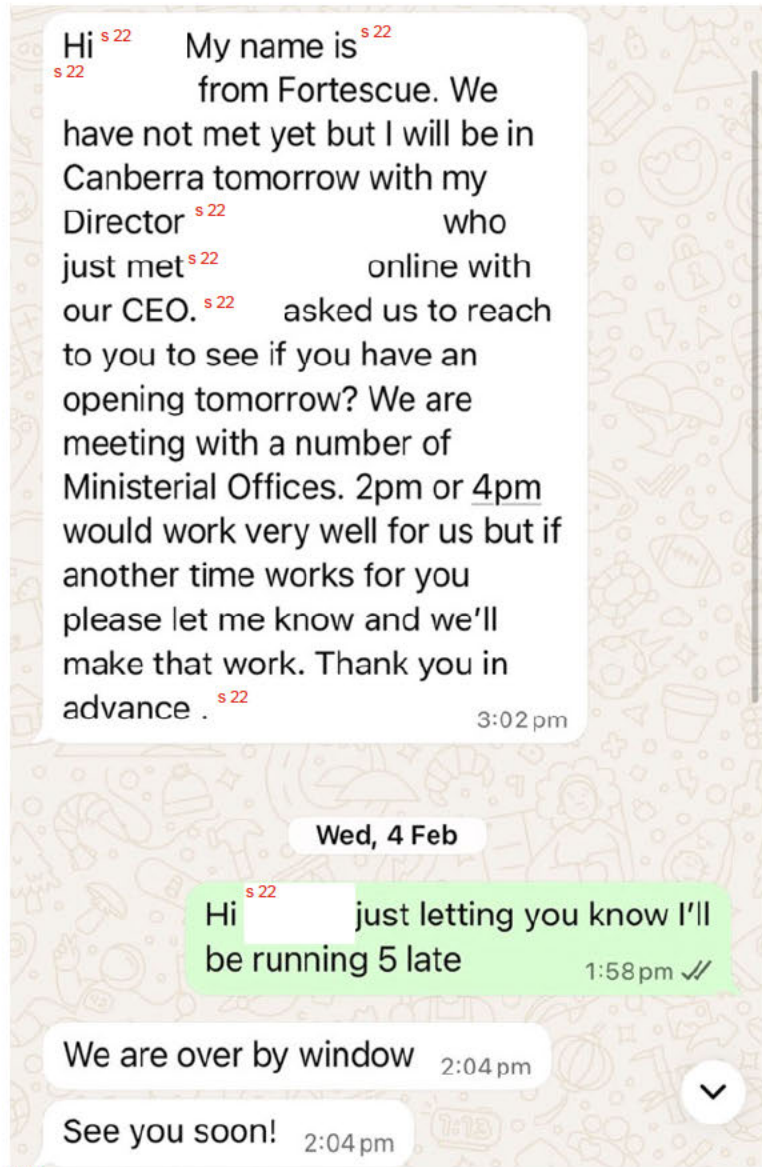
I have every confidence that, under your leadership, the Government will give this practical and important reform serious consideration.
